Everyone has the right to feel safe and you need to protect yourself Talk about unsafe situations you know your child might have been in, or could be in Our bodies give us warnings or cue that we are in a dangerous or bad situation Whenever you feel uncomfortable you need to get away Discuss situations where your child has felt unsafe
